Monthly Recipe

Cheesy Potatoes

5 lb. bag of red potatoes, cooked & cubed (unpeeled)

1-2 lbs. bacon, cooked & crumbled

4 cups (1 lb) cheddar cheese, cubed

4 cups (1 lb) shredded sharp cheddar cheese (sometimes I use medium cheddar)

1 large onion, finely chipped

1 cup mayonnaise (the real stuff)

1 cup sour cream

1 Tbsp green onion, sliced

1 Tbsp salt

½ tsp pepper

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Combine potatoes & bacon in a large bowl. In another bowl, combine remaining ingredients; add to potato mixture and toss gently to coat. Transfer to greased 41/2 quart baking dish. Sometimes I use a 9x13 plus 8x8). Bake at 325 degrees, 50-60 minutes, uncovered.
