# The Pie Run 2008 – By Your Social Director

November 8<sup>th</sup> was a beautiful day for a run to Oak Glen to visit the apple orchards. The caravan to Oak Glen consisted of 7 cars from Coco's, and one addition as we went by Diamond Bar. The seven cars that launched in the morning were: Geoff and Ginger, Cliff and Michelle, Ron and Karen, Jennifer and Barbara, Chuck and Sue, Greg and Art and Marge. The Diamond Bar participant was Jill as we blasted by. Later on Mike and Kathy joined us. Since Dave and his family live in Moreno Valley, it made more sense for them to drive straight there and join us instead of driving 50 miles to our starting point and then turn around and go all the way back.

We left Coco's at Imperial and the 57 freeway at 7:15 and 75 minutes later we were in the Los Rios Rancho parking lot breathing in the fresh mountain air. Los Rios was first begun in 1906 when Howard L. Rivers, a grower, packer, and shipper from the Pasadena area purchased property from the Wilshires, over 300 acres, to expand his operation to include apples. He planted the largest apple orchards in all of Southern California, many of which are still in production today. Los Rios Ranch soon became known as

the place to get truckloads of quality mile-high grown apples. Fruit from the ranch has been shipped locally and globally over the years. The operation expanded as the shift from wholesale packing/shipping to retailing took hold in the 1950's. Soon a sales barn and bakery were built, picnic areas developed and cider operations enhanced to make the most of the growing numbers of visitors, eager for mountain fresh apples and the things made from them. They grow 22 varieties of apples, from heirlooms like Winesaps and Arkansas Blacks to newer types like Fujis and Galas. Many are available for U-pick, and all are carried in their store.

We got to the farm early because November is the season when most people come to Oak Glen in search of apples and parking later in the morning is in a dirt lot. So we arrived early, set up our picnic gear and began looking around. Not only does the farm have a country store with all 22 of their apple varieties already bagged, but they also have every other imaginable apple treat and apple related item available for sale. They even told me that even though the dill pickles looked like dill pickles, they were really dill granny smith apples. I believed them; Ginger did not. In addition to apples, the farm raises Pumpkins, Raspberries, Bartlett Pears and Bing Cherries. Most every one sampled the apples and the pies and the cookies.

As the day warmed up, many of the group took a short hike through the apple orchards. The trail wound through a grove of California evergreen trees like the Giant Redwood, and the Giant Sequoia. Then it wound its way around through the hillsides of the farm and down into a marshy area before winding its way back to the starting point by the orchards. At 11:30 we all jumped onto a hayride for a tour of the lower orchards and a history lesson about the farm and the surrounding area. During the hayride, yours truly serenaded the travelers with his harmonica renditions of Home on the Range, She'll Be Coming Round the Mountain and Camp Town Races. Later, after the hayride, some went to the petting zoo, and others watched kids turning the apple grinders to make pulp that was pressed down to remove the juice. It looked like it took about 50 apples to make a gallon of pure apple cider. Do you know the difference between apple cider and apple juice? Apple Cider is raw apple juice. Apple juice has been pasteurized and processed to remove the pulp. Finally after everyone had shopped until they dropped, enjoyed nature's beauty, and basked in the warm sunshine, we headed down off the mountain. Those that waited until the end, met in Calimesa at the Bob's Big Boy Restaurant for hamburgers and ice cream. We all agreed that this was yet another great event. Jennifer Spencer and Ed Norris! The Saturday night banquet was great! It was held at the new club house, with lots of great food, drink,


camaraderie, raffle prizes, and did I say drinks! The faithful proceeded back to Parumph to support the gambling establishments.

# **Recipe Corner**

#### **Tim's Favorite PUMPKIN CAKE**

- 1 yellow cake mix ( Duncan Hines Moist Deluxe Butter Recipe Golden)
- 4 Eggs
- 1 (29 ounce) can 100% pure pumpkin
- 1 Cup sugar
- 1 1/2 cube Butter
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg (cinnamon or pumpkin pie spice)
- 2/3 cup sweetened condensed milk (one half can 14 ounce)
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans (walnuts or almonds)
- 9 X 13 glass baking dish (spray with Pam)

#### 1.) Bottom layer

\*Set aside one cup of yellow cake mix. Mix the remaining cake mix with one egg and one cube of butter (melt butter in micro wave to liquid) into a paste. Distribute the paste down the center of the baking dish and (working with spatula) to make an even (as possible) layer covering the bottom of the dish.

#### 2.) Middle layer

Mix 1 can 100% pure pumpkin, 3 eggs, 2/3 cup sweetened condensed milk, 3/4 cup sugar and 1 tsp. cinnamon thoroughly and pour into baking dish over yellow cake bottom crust.

#### 3.) Top layer

Mix one cup of cake mix (set aside earlier) with 1/4 cup sugar 1 tsp. cinnamon and 1/2 cup chopped pecans. Remaining butter should be at room temperature, **do not melt into liquid.** Mix a little butter at a time until mixture is crumbly not pasty. If there is butter left over, that's ok. Crumble mixture over top of the pumpkin layer, covering the entire top of the cake. If you get enough butter into mixture it well melt into one layer.

Bake at 375 degrees for 15 minutes then reduce heat to 325 degrees for 20 to 40 minutes. Stick a toothpick in the center to test when it's done. The toothpick will come out clean when it's done. Butter burns easily on the bottom layer, watch temperature and the distribution of temperature.
