

Palm Springs Get-Away - October 18, 2008

The trip to the Palm Springs Ariel Tramway had something for everyone. For those that wanted to stay warm, they could stay at the base of the tram where it was 85 degrees. For those who wanted to be even warmer, they could just go a few short miles to downtown Palm Springs where it was 101 degrees. But for those of us that wanted to experience the refreshing feeling of clean crisp air, we went to the top of Mount San Jacinto where it was 52 degrees, not a cloud in the sky, where you could see just about forever and the smell of the Jeffery Pine wafted in the breeze. Thanks to City National Bank, we all were treated to 15% discount passes for the spectacular ride to the top.

The original cable car at the entrance of the lift station seems very small in comparison to the new cars that rotate in 2 complete revolutions from the bottom to the top of the mountain. Everyone has the opportunity to see the near vertical uplift of the mountain and the panoramic view of the desert below with its wind generators as far away as Cabazon. The ride was smooth and you could only tell that you were moving up when the cable car went over one of the 5 towers and we began to sway a bit.

At the top we all enjoyed the picnics that we had brought or purchased at the top at one of the restaurants. Some of us went for hikes while others just enjoyed the views:



Some fun facts about the Tramway are:

- 1. Approximately 12,800' with vertical ascent of 5,873' 15 minutes travel time one way.
- 2. Five towers support four 1-7/8" steel cables as well as four hauling cables, two auxiliary cables and a communications cable.
- 3. The first tower is the tallest at 214' high;
- 4. Tower Number Four is the shortest at 56 1/2' high.
- 5. The weight of steel in the five towers totals 263 tons; the weight of the 11 cables totals 330 tons.
- 6. The maximum span between towers is 3,455' between Towers 3 and 4.

The Palm Springs Aerial Tramway constructed in rugged Chino Canyon on the north edge of Palm Springs - about two hours by car from Los Angeles and San Diego - did not just happen. It required foresight, planning, financing and, most of all a vision. For years, it was the dream of a young electrical engineer named Francis F. Crocker to "go up there where it's nice and cool".

Within the Mount San Jacinto State Park and Wilderness are 54 miles of hiking trails which should be sufficient to satisfy the appetite of the most avid outdoor enthusiast. Trails range from the awe-inspiring five and one-half mile trek to the 10,834 foot peak of San Jacinto to the just over one mile nature walk through picturesque Long Valley, located just behind the Tram's Mountain Station.

At 2pm, after everyone enjoyed their stay, we met at the bottom and continued the caravan to Palm Desert through historic downtown Palm Springs where the outside temperature was 101. In Palm Desert we headed south on the Palms to Pines Highway toward Idyllwild on the back side of the Mount San Jacinto National Forest. In Idyllwild, we met at the Gastrognome Restaurant to enjoy a delightful meal and to talk about the fun at the top of the world.

After dinner we took the shortest route home down Highway 209 to Banning and back to home. Everyone thought that this was a great trip.
