Recipe Corner

Peach Cobbler for Men

Ingredients and tools

1 Number 12 cast iron Dutch Oven
1 roll heavy duty aluminum foil
1 hammer
1 large blade screw driver
1 pair of pliers
30 charcoal briquettes

2 of the cheapest white cake mixes you can find preferably without pudding
Cinnamon Spice

1 Number 10 can of sliced peaches in heavy syrup
3 tablespoons of hard butter

Process

1. Start charcoal in a pyramid shape in a suitable container like a BBQ or fire ring
2. Use hammer and screw driver to beat open can of peaches
3. Use pliers to completely remove the sharp and jagged edged lid
4. Line the Dutch Oven with aluminum foil so that the edges of the foil drape over the edge of the oven
5. When the charcoal is hot, place oven on pile and pour open can of peaches and syrup into the oven
6. When the liquid is boiling, open 2 cake mixes and pour over the liquid covering it completely
7. Sprinkle cinnamon over the mix and place 3 pats of butter on the mix
8. Use the hammer claw to lift the oven bail to remove the oven from the charcoal to rearrange the briquettes
9. Place the lid on the oven
10. Place 15 briquettes on the lid evenly spaced
11. Spread the remaining charcoal into an even pattern
12. Place the oven on top of remaining charcoal
13. Wait 45 minutes and remove the oven from the charcoal
14. Carefully remove the oven lid and be prepared to defend yourself from hungry critters who have been following their noses to the tantalizing aroma.
