Hillview brings hope through a safe therapeutic environment, to help children regain trust, a place to heal and away from serious emotional disturbances.

Through our volunteer and club events such as car shows, visits, work/clean up day, donations, garage sales, Corvette Super Sports donated not only many hours throughout the year but also monetary donations. HIS House and CHiPs, combined, have been recipients of \$5000 each year. We hope that this will continue with our SUPERSPORTS member's efforts.

Our House is a "home away from home" for families of children and children who are receiving medical treatment for cancer and other serious illnesses at all the area medical facilities. It is open to families of those children who are hospitalized and need to be close to their child who are receiving treatment at our facilities. Over 1700 families have stayed at our House since our opening in November, 1985.

The "Home Away From Home" offers 22 bedrooms with private bathrooms, a living room, family room, security, kitchen, dining room,

gymnasium, library and a playground with our Ronald McDonald, sitting on a bench made to make you smile.

Families are referred to our House by hospital social workers. The cost per day is nominal and waived if the family is unable to pay. Our House is supported by the generous gifts of services provided by the community at large.

"The Home Away From Home" is one of our ongoing fund-raising programs that help support our mission of being a "home away from home" for the families of children receiving medical treatment at area

medical facilities. Approximately 12 pounds of pop tabs will cover a family's \$5 room fee for a one-night stay.

Both shows were terrific, the weather couldn't have been better and it was great renewing old friendships and making new ones like Mike and Jackie who made the trip in from Colorado.

Saturday's show consisted of 3 judged classes and a Peoples choice event. The judged classes were concourse, Street Driven and Wash and Show. Each class having a specific criteria by which each car would be measured with the toughest class being concourse then Street Driven etc. The judges were well versed and very thorough, focusing on cleanliness and condition. A piece of lint on the carpeting, dust on the fire wall, fingerprints etc. Garnered a lengthy discussion and a subsequent loss of point(s).

We decided to enter our car for judging in the Street Driven Class given our car is now 3 years old and has endured nearly 10K miles of Ca. Highways, byways and sandstorms on the way to Pahrump. Numerous cars were trailered in (concourse no doubt) and as luck would have it the Street Driven class turned out to have the largest number of entries. The couple hours before towels down time couples feverishly attending to every last detail and we were no different. Lynn went thru the interior for a second and third time while I attended to the exterior shine. That being completed Lynn took on the windows insuring the removal of every spec of dust and even the remotest hint of a fingerprint while I was busy with an artists brush getting rid of dust under the hood. Our son Brian drove down Saturday with our '88 and entered it for judging in Wash and Shine but took time to assist with wheel detailing on the '06.

I awaited the judges as the instructions clearly stated you must be present when the car is judged as the judges are not allowed to touch the cars. Initially the car must be closed, windows up. As needed you must open doors, hood, trunk, glove box, console etc. when requested. After the judging is completed on your car and the scores are recorded the judging team offers to go over their findings which adds to the angst of the moment.

COSD posted, on their website, the judging criteria for each class, the points possible in each category and in essence created the challenge by which to compete. I know a lot of our club members have competed in judged shows in the past and having now competed with a better understanding of what it takes to compete we salute you.

Whether you attend these shows to compete for a trophy or simply to enjoy the venue you won't find better folks than Corvette folks and cruising together with a large club group makes the good times even better. 2 Arizona Clubs converged on Plastic Fantastic with over 30 cars and our neighbors, PCC in O.C., had nearly 40 cars in attendance. In all nearly 300 Corvettes adorned the peninsula grass at Sea Port Village for yet another display of magnificence.

I hope the numerous future car shows, rallies, racing events and get togethers bring more members out to enjoy the great times.

Classification Guide

Concours: Judged on excellence of appearance displaying fine individual examples of the Corvette marquee

Cars are judged to a high standard. Cleanliness and condition are paramount in this class. Restored cars driven infrequently or new cars whose owners possess detailing skills would be suited for this class. Interior, exterior and engine will be judged. Originality such as bolt markings, over spray in certain areas or numbers matching will not be considered in the awarding of points.

Street driven: Entrants who drive their car regularly and are willing to prepare entire car for judging.

Interior, exterior and engine will be judged. Judges will be awarding points based on cleanliness and condition. It is normal in this class for slight wear of the car to be apparent.

WASH AND SHOW: Generally for the first time participant or those who wish not to detail the engine compartment

Only the interior and exterior will be judged. Engine will not be judged. Judges will be awarding points based on cleanliness and condition. It is normal in this class for slight wear of the car to be apparent.

Peoples Choice: Entrants and spectators will receive a single ballot to vote for their favorite car in each year group or generation.

Tips for success

- ❖ Cleanliness and condition are the main criteria of the judges. Detail car to the areas indicated on the judging sheet for the class you entered

- ❖ Undercarriage will not be judged. However wheel wells and any visible frame seen from a squatting position will be judged
- ❖ Read display requirements provided to each participant, issued during show. This document contains valuable information for the participant

CONCOURS DISPLAY REQUIREMENTS




1. After car has been registered, teched, and parked, fill out information on Judging sheet. Place the judging sheet on the drivers seat.
2. **Detail the car to the requirements on your judging sheet!!!**
3. Remove all loose items from the interior of the car. This includes t-top covers, floor mats, seat covers as in sheep skin or any removable type. Everything from the storage compartments and glove box with the exception of owner's manual, warranty papers, and registration. In some classes this will include the trunk. Front end masks will also need to be removed.
4. Convertible tops must be up and removable hardtops or T-tops must be installed.
5. Windows shall be in the up position. Doors and trunks closed.
6. Displays such as signs, photos, trophies, or models are permitted, but will not be considered in the judging. Floor jacks and car jacks are not allowed. Wheels are not to be removed.
7. Stanchions will be allowed upon approval of Head Judge.
8. Car cleanup shall stop at 10 a.m. sharp! Periodic dusting of the body will be allowed.
9. If your car has not been judged by 2 p.m. Please notify any Judge.
10. If you are not assisting in judging, please stay near your car. This will help to expedite the process.
11. Points will not be deducted for exterior dust from weather conditions of the day.
12. **Please do not interrupt or disturb Judges while they are completing their duties!**
