
Under The Radar

Mattel and CHP Fundraiser

On August 10th, Corvette super Sports combined efforts with the Pomona Valley Corvette Association and participated in a Poker Rally from the Baldwin Park CHP office where CHP Officer Donnell Holmes works, to the Mattel Distribution Center in San Bernardino to raise funds for CHiPs for Kids and Hill View Acres. 




Corvette Super Sports Annual Car Show
