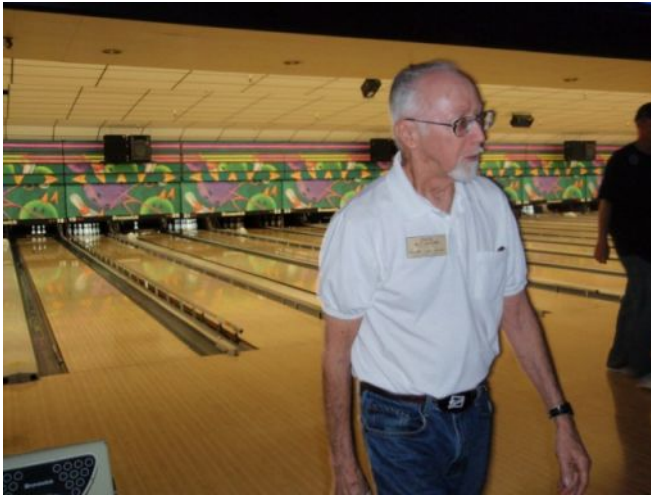


## Club Events for February

## **Homeland Security Begins At Home No. 2**

On February 20<sup>th</sup>, we once again ventured out to the prado Gun Range to hone our skills for our country. Clearly Art and Tracy have been putting in extra time at the range because their scores were nearly perfect. Yours truly has gotten progressively worse every time. After everyone left I did more practice on the Skeet Range where the pigeons fly directly at you from brick buildings on each side of the range as you can see in the picture below. I am not sure that the extra practice will pay off though. The current scores are on the web site for your amazement.

## Just in case you ever wanted to know about velocities and sizes of the shot in the shells, our Trap Ace, Art has provided the following information:

The amount of choke in a barrel is determined by subtracting the inside diameter of the choked area from the diameter of the bore, both measured with special gauges. A choke is considered Full if its choke diameter is .035 inches smaller than the bore.

A while ago, I heard that a minimum hit of 3 bb's is needed to break a target.

The effectiveness of a choke depends upon the shell load muzzle velocity, shot size and the gun's barrel. Below are some guidelines.

Keep in mind that we are shooting 16 yard trap (i.e. 16 yards from the trap house). Assume the target travels at 60 mph. That would be 5280 feet a minute or 88 feet a second. A target traveling at 30 mph is 2640 feet per minute or 44 feet a second. In 2 seconds that would be 88 feet or 29 yards. Actually, I don't know the speed of the traps at Prado, but I think it is between 30mph and 60 mph.

The American Le Mans Series will present two of this year's races in a new format, in an attempt to make tape-delayed broadcasts more relevant and compelling than simply replaying the race's on-track action.

The series is working with the Emmy Award-winning, Chicago-based Intersport production company on the project, which will influence the two ALMS races that CBS Sports will air in 2010.

Intersport produced the highly acclaimed *Truth in 24* documentary in 2008, a spectacular, award-winning film that chronicled Audi's quest for a fifth consecutive win at the 24 Hours of Le Mans. Intersport plans the same type of production for the ALMS events, with two 90-minute programs based on the races at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca in May and Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course in August. Intersport says it will combine the on-track action with interviews and other content from each race, including a behind-the-scenes look at the ALMS, as well as explaining the science, [technology](#) and history of road racing.

"Let's face it, all aspects of television as we've known it are changing rapidly," ALMS president Scott Atherton said. "And we believe that taking a status-quo approach and expecting a better result isn't going to work. We recognize the inherent risks of what we are doing with these CBS network broadcasts but, more importantly, we also believe there is an opportunity to deliver unprecedented entertainment to our fans and [value](#) to our teams and corporate partners."

The strategy might prove to be a good one, considering that both the Laguna and Mid-Ohio races will not be shown on television until a week after the events take place.

From the NCM:

Get Up Close and Personal with Corvette Racing April 29, 2010



Everyone knew that ALMS racing was going to get a lot more interesting when Corvette Racing entered the GT2 picture but few expected it to come to blows the way it did in the last race of the year at Laguna Seca on October 10, 2009. A collision between the No. 45 Porsche and the No. 3 Corvette C6.R sent the Corvette and driver Jan Magnussen head on into a concrete barrier at nearly 200 mph. In the end, Corvette Racing earned their fifth podium finish in five races since moving to the GT2 category.

This April, race fans will get the unique opportunity to lunch with Corvette Racing Program Manager Doug Fehan and C6.R No. 3 driver Johnny O'Connell, hearing "behind the scenes" stories and getting a preview of what to expect this season.

Fehan recently shared details with the National Corvette Museum about how Corvette Racing works with the Corvette Design team to develop a better race car, and how that technology is transferred into Corvettes built for consumers.

"Our guys do the driving at the test tracks and have input into the cars, looking at shock balance on the car, over-all handling and performance. GM takes what we learn in racing and they put it into play for you," said Fehan.

As part of the National Corvette Museum's C5/C6 Bash April 29 through May 1, 2010, Fehan and O'Connell will share information about why they made the move to the GT2 race program, and provide insight to the all new car for 2010.

"For GT2, we obviously wanted to come out strong and prove that we could be competitive, but only looked at the five-race schedule [in 2009] as a testing program for the car and the team," said Fehan. 2010 will be the first time the team has competed in GT2 at Le Mans. "If you come out you won't be disappointed as we wave the Corvette flag, taking on BMW, Porsche and Ferrari. We won't let you down," he added.



The luncheon and private autograph session is on Thursday, April 29 from 11am to 1pm. The fee is \$18 for National Corvette Museum members and \$25 for non-members.
