

The CSS Corvette Revue made a cameo appearance to the delight of the audience.

One of the club's honored guests was CHP Officer Donelle Holmes, the man that originated the CHiPS for kids program. He brought along a young lady named Sandra Ortiz to bring to life the CHiPS for kids program through its work in her life. These real life stories help us to understand the real benefits of our charitable giving program in the club. Later in the program, Terri, the director of HIS House in Placentia, another recipient of our charitable contributions, spoke about how HIS House works and how important CSS is to her program.

I would like you to meet Sandra, through the eyes of one of our own club members, Jackie Brinlee:

I had the pleasure of sitting next to a lovely young lady, Sandra Otiz, at the Awards Banquet. At first glance, I thought she looked awfully young to already have a Corvette, and wondered how she had accomplished that at such a young age! When Donelle introduced her as a recipient of the CHiPs for Kids program, I was excited to hear her story. I was so impressed with her composure and poise in front of a room of strangers. I doubt that I could carry that off with as much polish as she did.

I was ignorant of the fact that this program helped children of all ages including college students such as Sandra. She told us a wonderful story of how she had applied for a Study Abroad program through the University of Redlands in order to go to Peru. She was accepted to the program, but did not have the funds to pay for her airfare. She remembered that CHiPs for Kids had helped out with a relative of hers in the past, and let them know her situation. Thankfully, through their generosity, Sandra was able to realize her dream of going to Peru, and studying abroad.

Sandra showed me some pictures on her camera of her trip. She shared that the children in the classroom that she worked in loved having their picture taken and flocked around her whenever she took out her camera. She was there for about 4 weeks, and was totally immersed in the culture. Her group of 16 was split up and went to various villages to work with children, and stayed with host families. Since she is bilingual, she was able to easily communicate with the Peruvians, but the experience gave others in her group the opportunity to practice their Spanish! One of the highlights of her trip was an excursion along the Inca trail to view Machu Picchu. Her pictures of one of New Seven Wonders of the World looked like a postcard. I was so glad to have the opportunity to meet this inspiring girl and see first hand how our support of charities impacts lives.



Don't forget to "Save the Wave" by waving at other Corvettes when you're riding in your grandpa's 1981 Vette. Every year Vette has something special about it and an important place in Corvette history. The 1981 Corvette was the first model year to be built at the same time in two locations. The first Corvette to be completed at the new Bowling Green plant came off the assembly line on June 1, 1981. The last Corvette to be built at the St. Louis plant was completed on August 1, 1981. Chevrolet's "computer command control" used on 1980 Corvettes sold in California became standard equipment on all 1981 Vettes. The system automatically adjusted ignition timing and air-fuel mixture. A power seat became available in Corvettes for the first time in 1981 but on the driver's side only. The 1981 Corvette was the last model to have a manual transmission available until well into the 1984 production year. I hope you will learn a lot about Corvettes by being a member of FCOA.
