We also decided at the General Meeting to give our charities a total of \$8,000 based on our revenue from our car show and our cash reserves.



Dave MacDonald honored.

November 22nd. It was announced today by the National Corvette Museum, that racing legend the late Dave MacDonald, attendee at the first meeting of Corvette Super Sports and brother of former member Doug MacDonald has been inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame for 2014. Other inductees are author Jerry Burton and racer John Heinricy.

In February 1960, MacDonald had his first official ride as team driver for Don Steves Chevrolet at Willow Springs Raceway, where he won the Sunday main event. In his first year, Mac-Donald entered 15 regional races taking three outright wins, three second places and four third places, very impressive for a rookie.

Dave tragically died in a fiery crash during the 1964 Indy 500 along with driver Eddie Sachs. Dave was a rookie that year driving for racing legend Mickey Thompson.






























# Pie Run and Joy Ride!

Everyone has their own way to finesse the ball down the alley and as you can see this is a serious competition. Just look




# First Annual Holiday Car Show at "Back in the Day" - Benefit toy drive for CHPs for Kids.




eryone to look at. He has cars on consignment, cars for sale, and memorabilia from all kinds of automotive venues.
