Once every five years, Corvette owners from all over the country and beyond hear the call and begin their exodus to Bowling Green, Kentucky for the National Corvette Caravan. Individuals and clubs join groups along the way, forming long caravans reaching from coast to coast, converging on the National Corvette Museum the last week of August 2014. With fun stops along the way, this is something every Corvette enthusiast needs to do in their lifetime.

Labor Day weekend 2014 marks a major milestone in Corvette and Museum history; Corvette, the longest running single marque, is in its 7th generation and the Museum, a member driven organization, celebrates the 20th Anniversary of the Grand Opening. In keeping with tradition, which is one of the hallmarks of the Corvette world, the kick-off to the celebration starts with thousands of Corvette enthusiasts from all over the world making their way to Bowling Green, Kentucky in ever-growing caravans converging on the home of Corvette for 3+ days of exciting Corvette lifestyle.

Although months away from finalizing the on-site activities, planning for the <u>National Corvette Caravan</u> has been underway for several years. In one significant change from the past there will be only a single registration for both the 20th Anniversary Celebration and the National Corvette Caravan. Base registration is for the on-site event and there are options to add your Caravan selection, the Hall of Fame Induction Banquet, event shirt and, for Lifetime members, the Lifetime/VIP dinner.

As activities are finalized and an agenda created updates will be posted to this page and announcements will appear in <u>eNews</u> and on <u>Caravan Chat</u>.

All activities are open to Event Registrants only. On-line registrants will receive a hardcard credential, lanyard, and an event pin. Lifetime registration is free, member registration is \$15 per person and non-member registration is \$25 per person.

Caravan registration is \$5 per person. Please note – this is per person/ not per car.

BOTH participants in Corvette must register for the Caravan to be able to take part.

I even stand in awe of a particular Blue C6 that gets a passionate "Zano" finish as often as possible. I respect my waxer friends and envy nonwhite cars at how remarkable they look. Some times I even take my own picture in the reflection on their raised hoods. But my passion is Autocross. No q-tips, just masking tape. No spit and polish, just pedal to the metal.

But last weekend, even after the 5.1 earthquake that rattled all our houses, a group of intrepid CSS Waxers went on a caravan to International Aero Services in Bellflower. The members who went were Tony, Rick, Ron, Dave M,, Doug, and Gary. Our hosts were very cordial and they provided coffee, donuts and juice.

Now our band of merry men are not first time waxers. They are professionals. They go to judged shows, they have 1000count boxes of q-tips, and they even have a little of Tom Sawyer in them by telling people that it is fun to rub the wax off their cars and getting them to do it too.

But one such waxer told me that he actually learned some new tricks. This is what he had to say:

Here's a couple of tricks that I had learned and surprisingly it's so easy to do that you just don't think about it.

1) When cleaning your Windows, clean one side horizontally and the other vertically. This way if you see streaks you'll know which side of the glass there on.

2) Most Corvette owners who have a dark color (example red, black etc.) know that when they wax their car they're going to get streaks in the paint. Trick no.2 is when waxing your car, wax it in small 2 square-foot areas and immediately wipe off the wax with a clean microfiber towel. This will greatly reduce the streaking.

If you wish you had gone, they will be at the next meeting to talk about their products and their process.

NCCC Regional News

Since we have so many new members in CSS, I thought it would be a good idea to inform you and all our members what our NC-CC regional representatives do to keep our region running smoothly. The

following is an excerpt from the West Coast Region Bylaws:

REGIONAL EXECUTIVE - Allen Morris

The RE shall be the organizational head of the REGION. He/she will call and preside at all Regional meetings and take care of the general business of running the REGION in the manner determined by the Board of Governors. On business matters that have been printed in the minutes of the meeting and have laid on the table for one Regional meeting, a non attending club may voteby submitting a written vote to the RE. The RE may be responsible for making all necessary arrangements for a Regional awards banquet to be held at the end of the competition year over which he/she presided. The RE will also deal with all matters concerning NCCC as outlined in the NCCC Constitution. In The absence or disability of the RE, the RCD shall perform the duties of the RE.

REGIONAL COMEPETITON DIRECTOR - Joe Orrico (CSS) The RCD is a member of the NCCC Competition Committee, chaired by the Vice President of Competition of NCCC. He/she will authorize all NCCC sanctioned activities in the REGION. Prior to each competition year, the RCD will inform as per NCCC rules, the procedures for the sanctioning, holding, and reporting of results of regional competition events. Event flyers and results are handled through the RCD for tabulation of competition points earned by members of the REGION. All competition related grievances are filed with the RCD. Other and more specific duties not in conflict with the duties outlined in this section, are listed in the NCCC Competition Sanction Program Handbook. The RCD shall publish a monthly statement to all Governors including upcoming events in all Regions, point standings, and any other items of interest. He/she will also be responsible for acquiring and presenting awards for the year in which he/she presided. In the event that he/she cannot fulfill the obligation of acquiring the awards, this duty will be passed to the RE of the year following the competition year. In the absence throughout the year of the RE, the RCD may perform the duties of the RE.

REGIONAL MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR - Cliff Harris The RMD is a member of the NCCC Membership Committee, chaired by the Vice President of Membership of NCCC. He/she shall provide information and answer correspondence from members and non-members relating to NCCC and collect or monitor collection of all Regional annual dues payments. In the absence of the RE and RCD, the RMD shall perform the duties of one or all offices.

REGIONAL SECRETARY - Cindy Orrico (CSS)

The RS is a Regional officer only with no direct authorization from, nor connection with NCCC. Duties shall include the taking of minutes at all Regional Meetings and the mailing of copies of those minutes to each club Governor in the REGION. The RS shall maintain copies of the minutes of all meetings to be turned





over to subsequent RSs and shall help other regional officers with their correspondence when needed and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the RE or the Board of Governors.

REGIONAL TREASURER - Ellis Chee (CSS)

The RT is a Regional officer only with no direct authorization from, nor connection with NCCC. He/she will handle all monies of the REGION, maintain accounts and disburse funds as directed by the officers of the REGION and the Board of Governors. The RT shall take the financial records to an independent auditor for a statement to be completed by January 31 st. He/she will also be responsible for the filing of any forms related to the finances of the REGION or to the Secretary of State under the statement of incorporation. The RT shall inform the RE and RCD of clubs that are in default for dues for appropriate action


As you can see, not only do our members participare in our regional events, they give of their time to the Regional Board to keep our region running smoothly.
