CORVETTE C7.R

The C7.R Corvette was victorious at the 12 Hours of Sebring on the 19th of March. This was just the last race these yellow super cars have won. How does this amazing car get to this point in time.

The C7.R is an upgrade from the current Z06 that is available to the public from Chevrolet. It races in the sports car class GTLM (Le Mans). It is built by Chevrolet and Pratt-Miller Engineering Company in Michigan. Tadge Juechter, the Corvette Chief Engineer, headed up the design of the new C7. The C7.R has the same chassis as the regular C7. The engine is an LS5.R, 5.5L, 336 cubic inch with two valves per cylinder. It puts out 491 horsepower @ 6000 RPM. The C.7R weighs 2,745 lbs. including driver and fuel. The transmission is an XTAC 6-speed, semi automatic with paddle shift.

The race team for the C7.R consists of seven drivers: Antonio Garcia, Tommy Milner, Jan Magnussen, Ryan Briscoe, Jordan Taylor, Oliver Gavin and Robin Liddell.

In the past 16 races, the Corvette has won 6 of them. In 2015, they won the first two races of the year...24 Hours of Daytona and 12 Hours of Sebring. Because the promoters of the races want parity (all cars equal), they penalized the Corvette because they were too good, thus making them have a smaller fuel tank. It doesn't seem fair as all cars are suppose to be equal.

This year the C7.R won their class in the 24 Hours of Daytona in a photo finish. The race was hyped because the new Ford GT made its debut after 50 years, but the 2 Fords finished 32 and 162 laps down to the Corvette.

Here's hoping the Corvette Racing Team will have continued success. The next race will be in Long Beach in April.

Road Trip March 2016 - Part 1

Wednesday night March 2nd I left on a road trip with my brother Jon and my nephew Jimmy "johnson" heading to New York. Now on every other occasion I can ever think of I look forward to a good road trip. Even that one time we were supposed to go to Mammoth and 15 feet of snow fell. I still lobbied to drive to Bishop, but alas cooler heads prevailed and we didn't take that road trip. However, this time instead of anticipation I felt a sense of anxiety.

You see our Uncle Julius, my God Father, passed away after a brave fight against brain cancer. I knew I should go, I was his God Son. I knew I should go to support my Aunt. I knew I should go to represent the California relatives. But, it was early March, my brother wanted to take I70 through the Rockies, a nonstop endeavor to be in New York Friday evening.

We did the drive in 41 hours total time, 37 hours driving time at an average of 70 mph. We had one hiccup early on in Utah. The speed limits are 80mph on the interstate, my nephew was driving, I had reached over and set the cruise control for 79, then fell asleep. Jimmy got pulled over about an hour into his shift for going 87. We had 3 Utah State Troopers, and a dog. Jimmy got a warning and a new nickname. "Jimmy johnson."

After the funeral service we visited family. The first museum we went to was the Pierce-Arrow Museum in Buffalo. When a Model T cost \$300 a Pierce-Arrow cost \$3,500; very nice cars indeed. They had one 1963 split window Corvette on display, despite my best offer of a 2011 Corvette and \$500 cash in exchange for the 1963. They did not accept. In 1927 Frank Lloyd Wright designed a Tydol gas station in art decco style for the city of Buffalo. It would have cost \$1,700 to build at the time, but he also wanted \$2,700 for the rights and the blue prints. The roof of the gas station was where the main gas storage was going to be. It had modern amenities such as, indoor men's and women's restrooms, a driver's lounge area with a wood burning fire place, and a downs stairs rest area with a wood burning fire place. It was never built. That is until the museum built it to scale as an exhibit. They said it cost more than \$1,700 to build and the blue prints cost more than \$2,700.

Road Trip March 2016 - Part 2

Now every family has stories of someone doing something, sometimes legal sometimes not, and sometimes even significant. My family has several stories. One is about "Uncle Frank" who worked for Bell aircraft. Uncle Frank, my great Uncle, started working for Bell in 1941; he was a welder. During WWII, and all the airplanes being produced, he was part of a group of twenty-one people who were developing the first viable helicopter. We had photos of his that I saw for the very first time in my life. We donated 28 pictures, company newsletters and even two welding manuals that he had kept. There's a picture of Uncle Frank "flying" the Bell 30 prototype helicopter with the test pilot. The engine isn't running. Even one photograph published in an extensive history of the Bell 47 helicopter is very similar to the one we had. But the one picture that stopped the docent and made him call the curator/director of the museum was of Uncle Frank welding an assembly onto the rotor. While waiting for the curator to arrive my brother and Uncle Edwin started to wander around the museum, at one point shouting across the room "we know who number 5 is!" I just shrugged and looked confused. There is a picture displayed with the original 21 people, 14 of which are named. When the curator arrived and started going through the pictures he stopped for a moment. When he saw that picture he said "Do you know how rare this photograph is? I have never seen this before." He went on to explain what it was and that the only known pictures were taken from the ground looking up at the helicopter. He apologized for having to leave because he had another meeting to attend and took the pictures with him. About 1 1/2 hours later he returned and told us that the one picture was already uploaded to the Bell 47 Facebook page. He had the picture scanned and sent to the main Bell museum in Texas. No one there had ever seen it either. The caption reads: "Frank Torba welding the 'Sweedish brace' with Floyd Carlson the inventor which allowed helicopters to fly faster than 70mph. 8/1943." Three days prior to us donating our pictures, the family of the test pilot donated the number plate from the tail boom of Bell model 47 serial #1 to the museum. The curator asked us if we had seen it, which we had. He asked if we had seen the back of it, which we had not. He told us that after the crash of the first production helicopter, April 4, 1946, licensed by the predecessor of the FAA for flight "everyone" signed it to which I replied, "Then Uncle Frank has to be there." We looked at the back and it said, "Best wishes for a speedy recovery" with Frank Torba's signature. That's when the curator said, "We'll have the picture (of the original 21 people) updated tomorrow." Number 5 has a name, and it is Uncle Frank, Uncle Frank retired from Bell in 1968, the last program he worked on was the Lunar Module (LEM) that landed on the Moon.

Uncle Frank also kept an October 1944 news paper, but we didn't know why. My Uncle Harry found an article stating that the test pilot was promoted at Bell; that's probably why Uncle Frank kept it all these years. However, on the front page was the obituary for the founder and president of Pierce-Arrow, so we decided to donate that to the Pierce-Arrow museum.


Sergeant at arms Ron DeBartolomeis called the meeting to order at 1903 and led the assemblage in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

President Tony Schavone welcomed all and thanked all for their attendance. He introduced D.J. from Connell Chevrolet who explained that even though the club cannot hold their car show at Connell this year due to Chevrolet marketing restraints, they can still be counted on as the club sponsor, providing the trophies and t-shirts for the car show this year.

Vice President Donna Stewart introduced the evening's guests: Dan Cantrell and Rick and Renee Suierveld.

Tony turned the next portion of the meeting over to Secretary Bert Wiest to explain and vote on the Calicinto Publicity Chairperson Richard Cheek reported that the Ranch situation. For those of you who have been into Corvettes for awhile most – or all – of the following will not be news to you, but for you relative newcomers to the love of Vettes this offering is being made to help you find the parts you may need for your classic or the trim add-ons you might want to buy to personalize your Vette or the clothing, gear, etc. you might like to own to show others of your interest in the sport.

It's amazing just how many publications are out there that are dedicated to Corvettes and how helpful many of them can be. Following is a list and quick summary of the more popular catalogs that you might want to look into. Most of them are available for routine periodic mailing if you request it, and most of them have a web site from which you can peruse their offerings. Me, I prefer to receive the catalogs so that I can better see just what's out there I might not have not seen before.

The three largest, most popular catalogs with the most items that are non-"parts" are:

Those publications periodically also publish catalogs geared specifically for a single generation of Corvettes so when they ask you for the year and model you drive don't be afraid to tell them.

Then there are catalogs that are almost exclusively for parts, especially of older model Corvettes:

- b. J & D Corvette, www.jdcorvette.com, (800) 838-8353 (located locally in Bellflower, CA).

For trim and accessory items as well as clothes, furniture and the like, you should look at:

- a. Corvette Central, www.CorvetteCentral.com, (800) 345-4122. They have an accessories catalog and a separate catalog of parts, etc., for each generation of Corvettes.
- b. Burston Marketing's Corvette Collection, www.CorvetteCollection.com, (800) 653-1375.
- c. And finally, the catalog from the retail store at the National Corvette Museum, www.CorvetteMuseum.org, (800) 538-3883.

In addition to the above, you might also consider visiting the show rooms of Corvette Mike's at 1133 North Tustin Avenue and West Coast Corvettes, 1210 N. Kraemer Blvd., both are located near each other in Anaheim just off the 91 freeway in Anaheim. They have a selection of GM authorized accessories and clothes for sale, as well as an indoor Corvette sales room with used road gems. Both also maintain service departments for installing accessories and the like and for general maintenance of Corvettes. West Coast Corvettes has a new catalog that was just released and is available for pick-up at the store. (Price is pre-printed on each catalog as \$12.95, but don't be fooled, they're free - just ask for one.)




















