










President Tony



November has always been one of my favorite months due to the Thanksgiving holiday.

Thanksgiving gives us time to stop and reflect on everything we have in our life. There will always be struggles, hardships, times of sorrow, sadness, and all the things life gives to us. Life is not easy. I have heard said many times that "It is not what you are dealt in life, but how you deal with it". Great words to live by, but not always easy to follow.

Thanksgiving Thursday gives us a chance to review and look at ourselves and our life and be thankful for what we do have: the good times, successes, happiness, joys, friends, family and all that we have in life. Life is good. Definitely this is better than the alternative.

I was up late one night on the NCCC website looking at old issues of Blue Bars. The first issue of Blue Bars was in 1962. I found some interesting messages from some of the officers over 55 years ago. I want to thank Joan Thomas for taking the time, a lot of time, to scan all the old issues of BB's so there is a history of them for everyone to review. The past is good to keep tabs on how, why and when NCCC began and how it has remained stable all the way to November 2017. The folks who started NCCC had a goal and a direction and it is still here today. I want to share parts of two issues. The first item is from page 3 Volume one, Issue 1, the first issue. I am not sure who wrote this. I assume it was President Richard Wolf:

"WE ARE A COUNCIL ---- NOT A GORVERNING BODY"

"First, the purpose of the Council shall be to further the ideas and purposes of Corvette owner-member and their individual club. While this loosely defines a pretty broad ground of endeavor, it serves to underline the fact that only through united Council activity can individual Corvette clubs achieve **greater success**. A council means that each member club shares in the Council activity and responsibility."

The next statements are from page 11 & 12, Volume 2, Issue 1, 1963 written by James Phillips:

"Why should I join the National Council? What's in it for me?" Not a bad question. It's one, in fact, that we hear quite frequently, and one that deserves a straight forward truthful answer. The answer, in plain terms, is **NOTHING**. The answer is loud and clear. Because you want to have more fun with your Corvette, owners-the list could go on and on. It's really limited only by your imagination."

"The Council is yours. You run it. It is not a governing body—only a planning and coordinating body. It depends upon its member clubs for support, direction, and growth. The mainstay of every member Council club is each individual member. In short, **YOU.**"

In 1963 it costs \$.04 cents to mail out each issue of Blue Bars. Today it costs about \$1.00. In 1963 a gallon of gasoline was around \$.26 cents. Today a gallon is \$2.00 or more. How THAT has changed! But the message from 55 years ago is still the same in 2017. We are all members of NCCC. How have **YOU** been involved in growing NCCC? What have you done for your club other than just being a member? I guess what I am trying to say is as 2018 is around the corner, get involved in doing something to support your club which in turn supports NCCC. I have learned that if a person puts nothing in, don't expect to get anything out.

As 2018 membership renewals finish up this month, be thankful for all we have. I have said it before; "over 290 million people do not own a Corvette." We are the lucky ones! If you belonged to a club golf course, would you never play golf there? As a member of NCCC in 2018, get involved somehow. You won't regret it and you may even find out you enjoy NCCC a whole lot more.

As 2017 is coming to an end, my good friend Howard Curtis has a saying I really like: Don't let your memories be bigger than your dreams". Be an NCCC "DREAMER" in 2018 and make memories!

RMD Message

Hi Governors,

Friday, September 8. Membership Committee meeting.

The digital membership card printing guide can be found under "Members Only" on the NCCC web site. Username:NCCCMemberPassword: 1963SplitWindow

It was suggested that the card be converted to PDF so that everybody can print it.

Some members REALLY want a plastic card.

High speed certification is entered into the database by the RCD.

RMDs must do the MAL cards.

Don't mark any NCCC messages as spam. It damages NCCC's "reputation" on the web. That has multiple consequences, including the possibility of the web blocking all NCCC messages and lowering NCCC's ranking in searches.

Saturday, September 9. National Governors meeting.

VP of Membership Amelia Workman said that governors should put "transfer" in the comment section of a member's entry when they are transferred.

Business Manager Jack Wilson said that if alcohol is served at an event that it must be given away to be covered by NCCC's insurance. He said the 2020 Convention is open, so any club/region can apply.

Parliamentarian Kathy Brisbois said there will be no newsletter contest for 2018 due to lack of participation in recent years.

IT Director Walt Jenkins said the NCCC web site will be transferred from DomainHost to GoDaddy some time in early January. He said that emails from NCCC do NOT contain spam and only go out once a month. That would be President Dave Heinemann's message on the 1st of each month.

NCM ambassador Dave Goebel said that you can use your NCM member number to get a \$1000 discount on a new Corvette.

Guy Larson (owner of Bloomington Gold) talked about the event. He said new for 2018 are: a Friday night cruise, Saturday night road tour, hospitality suites for the entire weekend and free T-shirts for large groups. There will be a "67 L-88 explosion" on Saturday afternoon and they hope to get the largest gathering of L-88s seen to date.

Jerry Britner, 2018 Convention Coordinator said the Convention web site will be updated daily. There will be a Mardi Gras party with costume awards. Note that there is a Mardi Gras store across the street from the hotel.

The voting results were announced. The important result is that the 2019 Convention will be in Denver, CO.

For those of you who have been into Corvettes for awhile most – or all – of the following will not be news to you, but for you relative newcomers to the love of Vettes this offering is being made to help you find the parts you may need for your classic or the trim add-ons you might want to buy to personalize your Vette or the clothing, gear, etc. you might like to own to show others of your interest in the sport.

It's amazing just how many publications are out there that are dedicated to Corvettes and how helpful many of them can be. Following is a list and quick summary of the more popular catalogs that you might want to look into. Most of them are available for routine periodic mailing if you request it, and most of them have a web site from which you can peruse their offerings. Me, I prefer to receive the catalogs so that I can better see just what's out there I might not have not seen before.

The three largest, most popular catalogs with the most items that are non-"parts" are:

- b. Eckler's Corvette, <u>www.ecklersCorvette.com</u>, (800) 327-4868;
- c. Corvette America, <u>www.CorvetteAmerica.com</u>, (800) 458-3475.

Those publications periodically also publish catalogs geared specifically for a single generation of Corvettes so when they ask you for the year and model you drive don't be afraid to tell them.

Then there are catalogs that are almost exclusively for parts, especially of older model Corvettes:

- b. J & D Corvette, <u>www.jdcorvette.com</u>, (800) 838-8353 (located locally in Bellflower, CA).

For trim and accessory items as well as clothes, furniture and the like, you should look at:

- a. Corvette Central, <u>www.CorvetteCentral.com</u>, (800) 345-4122. They have an accessories catalog and a separate catalog of parts, etc., for each generation of Corvettes.
- b. Burston Marketing's Corvette Collection, <u>www.CorvetteCollection.com</u>, (800) 653-1375.
- c. And finally, the catalog from the retail store at the National Corvette Museum, <u>www.CorvetteMuseum.org</u>, (800) 538-3883.

In addition to the above, you might also consider visiting the show rooms of Corvette Mike's at 1133 North Tustin Avenue and West Coast Corvettes, 1210 N. Kraemer Blvd., both are located near each other in Anaheim just off the 91 freeway in Anaheim. They have a selection of GM authorized accessories and clothes for sale, as well as an indoor Corvette sales room with used road gems. Both also maintain service departments for installing accessories and the like and for general maintenance of Corvettes. West Coast Corvettes has a new catalog that was just released and is available for pick-up at the store. (Price is pre-printed on each catalog as \$12.95, but don't be fooled, they're free - just ask for one.)




