President Tony

The Corvette Super Sports Club started on April 18, 1959. This is our 60th year which makes us one of the oldest Clubs in Southern California.

The first meeting of the Club was held at Don Steve's Chevrolet in La Habra. Among the attendees at that first meeting was Carroll Shelby, Bob Bondaurant, Dave MacDonald and Bill Thomas. Who were these men and what did they do?

Carroll Shelby was an automotive designer, race driver and entrepreneur. He is best known for his involvement with the Cobra and the Mustang.

Bob Bondaurant (85 years old) drove Corvettes in the 60's. In 1963 he raced in a '63 Stingray Z06, winning 30 of 32 races. He worked on the film "Grand Prix", training James Garner to drive formula cars. In 1967, driving a 1967 Corvette L88 Coupe at La Mans, he broke a wrist pin, which ended his day. After a serious accident, leaving him with the possibility of not walking again, he came up with the idea of a high-performance driving school. He still operates this school in Arizona.

Dave MacDonald was an early Corvette racer. Driving a 1960 Corvette and being sponsored by Don Steve's Chevrolet, he won 52 races out of 118. Dave died in 1964 racing in the Indy 500. He was 27 years old.

Bill Thomas was a car designer and builder. He developed the Chevrolet powered Cheetah sports car to compete with the Ford powered Cobras.



For those of us anxiously waiting to get our hands on the new C8 mid-engine corvette, there are problems. It will be delayed due to several issues. It has problems in the electrical system, and due to the high horsepower, issues with the frame bending and also some reported cracks. We will have to wait a little longer for the debut.

Odd Facts - **GM lied about horsepower.** The L88 engine was basically a racing engine for the street, so to discourage too many people from ordering it, Chevrolet published numbers that were about 70 horsepower below the actual rating, so that it would look less appealing than other engines. It worked — only 20 Corvettes were ordered with the L88 in 1967.

The first Corvettes were too advanced for the factory. Because the Corvette was the first fiberglass body that GM mass produced, the factory was ill-equipped to handle the new tech, and they didn't know how to ground the car. The first few cars they made wouldn't start. Instead of driving them off the assembly line, they had to push.

"Out of every 100 men, 10 should not be there, 80 are nothing but targets, 9 are real fighters and we are blessed to have them for they the battle make. Aw but one, one of them is a warrior, and he will bring the others home." - Heraclitus

Every day 22 Veterans take their lives. That's a staggering statistic. That's 8,000 a year... one every 65 minutes. After proudly serving our country many of them have returned with disabilities ranging from PTSD, traumatic brain injury, spinal injuries and loss of limbs. They are our quiet warriors, struggling in silence against pain, a sense of loneliness and a feeling they don't belong.

Dive Warriors is dedicated to empowering these brave men and women on their road to recovery through the therapeutic qualities of scuba diving. We offer an environment of personal growth, comradery and a social setting where they can interact with other disabled veterans with similar issues. Through scuba diving, they overcome challenges and get relief from stress and the pain they deal with on a daily basis.

At Dive Warriors, our programs are designed to help improve lives of our wounded service members. We are a non-profit charity dedicated to helping disabled veterans by offering training and diving excursions in the challenging sport of scuba diving, an activity which has proven to help with the rehabilitation process. It instills a sense of confidence and helps many with controlling their stress. The water creates a weightless environment for those struggling with physical impairments and offers them a freedom they can't find on land.

Dive Warriors goes beyond providing the skills to become certified divers. We also fund trips to take our veterans to locations where they can actually dive. These interactions provide a network that builds morale while creating social connections with others who understand the difficulties they face every day. A lot of service-members live on fixed incomes and this is a chance for them to step outside their daily routine, and form new and lasting friendships while improving their lives.





























COOL MAP APP

Ever get in the mood for a nice little spontaneous drive or ride and not be able to decide where to go? If you have an Apple iOS platform, there is a free app that might just solve your dilemma. Go to the App Store and download PORSCHE ROAD TRIP to your device. A cooperative and competent navigator can monitor the device and provide you with instructions. Better yet, use bluetooth or USB cable to connect with your radio. A pleasant male voice will direct you turn by turn.

When you access PORSCHE ROAD TRIP, you will probably be able to quickly figure out how to manage it. If you would like a little tutoring, here it is:

- -Touch the pen/pencil icon in the upper right corner of the screen. This will allow you to choose a departure location. Maybe it is to be your home or a meeting place.
- -Return to "Route Generator" screen.
- -Move the black marker around the compass to select a general direction for your journey.
- -Touch "miles" to select a distance from 30 to 180 miles.
- -Touch the blue "Generate Route" bar. You will see an overview of your complete route. Not happy? Go back and change compass direction or distance.
- -Touch "Start Route" and begin your adventure by following directions. It will return you to your starting point. The red "Exit" prompt will simply return you to the overview.
- -Along the way you may want fuel or food. Swipe your screen upward from the bottom and select an icon for what you desire. You will be directed to a nearby gas station, cafe or parking opportunity.

In PORSCHE ROAD TRIP you will notice "Road Trips" and "Explore." Click on those to view preplanned routes provided by Porsche.

Driving a Porsche is not a requirement for using this app. It is ok if you drive a Corvette or Harley Davidson! Not sure about other vehicles.

Where You Can Find Corvette Parts and Merchandise

For those of you who have been into Corvettes for awhile most – or all – of the following will not be news to you, but for you relative newcomers to the love of Vettes this offering is being made to help you find the parts you may need for your classic or the trim add-ons you might want to buy to personalize your Vette or the clothing, gear, etc. you might like to own to show others of your interest in the sport.

It's amazing just how many publications are out there that are dedicated to Corvettes and how helpful many of them can be. Following is a list and quick summary of the more popular catalogs that you might want to look into. Most of them are available for routine periodic mailing if you request it, and most of them have a web site from which you can peruse their offerings. Me, I prefer to receive the catalogs so that I can better see just what's out there I might not have not seen before.

The three largest, most popular catalogs with the most items that are non-"parts" are:

- a. Mid America Motorworks, <u>www.mamotorworkscom</u>, (800) 500-1500;
- b. Eckler's Corvette, www.ecklersCorvette.com, (800) 327-4868;
- c. Corvette America, <u>www.CorvetteAmerica.com</u>, (800) 458-3475.

Those publications periodically also publish catalogs geared specifically for a single generation of Corvettes so when they ask you for the year and model you drive don't be afraid to tell them.

Then there are catalogs that are almost exclusively for parts, especially of older model Corvettes:

- b. J & D Corvette, www.jdcorvette.com, (800) 838-8353 (located locally in Bellflower, CA).

For trim and accessory items as well as clothes, furniture and the like, you should look at:

- a. Corvette Central, www.CorvetteCentral.com, (800) 345-4122. They have an accessories catalog and a separate catalog of parts, etc., for each generation of Corvettes.
- b. Burston Marketing's Corvette Collection, www.CorvetteCollection.com, (800) 653-1375.
- c. And finally, the catalog from the retail store at the National Corvette Museum, www.CorvetteMuseum.org, (800) 538-3883.

In addition to the above, you might also consider visiting the show rooms of Corvette Mike's at 1133 North Tustin Avenue and West Coast Corvettes, 1210 N. Kraemer Blvd., both are located near each other in Anaheim just off the 91 freeway in Anaheim. They have a selection of GM authorized accessories and clothes for sale, as well as an indoor Corvette sales room with used road gems. Both also maintain service departments for installing accessories and the like and for general maintenance of Corvettes. West Coast Corvettes has a new catalog that was just released and is available for pick-up at the store. (Price is pre-printed on each catalog as \$12.95, but don't be fooled, they're free - just ask for one.)





















These events are sanctioned by the National Council of Corvette Clubs, Inc. (NCCC). Autocross classifications are as outlined in NCCC guideline. For members of NCCC, the sanction numbers are WC-518-003 and WC-518-004. Non-NCCC members and all makes of cars and trucks are welcome to participate. All non-NCCC member participants will be placed in one of the following four groups. A and B Men's and A and B Women's. Open A are vehicles that utilize Uniform Tire Quality Grade (UTQG) treadwear rating 200 or less. Open B is rating 201 or greater. Non-NCCC Corvettes the meet the safety and classification requirement of a NCCC class may participate in that class for trophies but they will not be awarded points, nor affect member's points.

Registration is accepted online only at motorsportreg.com. There will be no registration the day of the event. If two participants are driving the same car, both must register as separate drivers. Participants must be 18 years old. Registrants will receive an email registration confirmation with car number. Please be sure you email address is correct on your online registration.

SNELL approved "SA" or "M" helmets less than 10 years old are required. Drivers must wear securely fitting shoes with closed toes. Entrants will be divided into groups for both the morning and afternoon events. Unless physically unable, all participants will be asked to volunteer as course safety workers.


Santa Maria Airport is a TSA controlled facility with strictly enforced security. Vapor Trail Vettes must conduct this event accordingly. Participants must enter and leave via one secure gate monitored by a TSA guard. The gate will open at 7:00 am and will be closed at 8:00 am and unmanned until the event's conclusion. We strongly urge you to arrive no later than 8:00am. No one will be allowed to enter after 8:00 am. All participants must sign an event waiver and workers will be issued a wrist band that must be worn at all times within the TSA boundaries. Drivers will be issued a wrist band when checking in at the autocross trailer. Once you enter the TSA controlled zone, you must leave through the secured gate only once. One entry and one exit only. Ensure you have everything you need for the day including enough fuel for all runs. All entrants must be a driver or a volunteer event worker. Sorry, TSA regulations do not allow this to be a spectator event.











CORVETTE PIRATES PANAMA CANAL TRANSIT – TAMPA TO LONG BEACH







· ITINERARY





Weather - Come to Panama in February, March, September and October for the least chance of rain, although any month from mid-December to the beginning of May is fairly dry. The Panama Canal Zone has a tropical climate ranging from 75 to 85 degrees Fahrenheit, with high humidity year-round. The Caribbean side of the canal receives twice the amount of rain as Panama City and is infamous for having short, sudden afternoon thunderstorms from April through July.

Our Panama Canal Cruise on the Carnival Miracle will surely be a truly amazing experience that should not be missed. The Panama Canal is an engineering marvel built from 1903-1914. About 14,000 ships use it every year. The canal is about 48 miles long. It functions as a waterway between North and South America. The canal connects the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. Before the canal was built, ships had to sail 13,000 miles around the tip of South America and Cape Horn. How do the ships get raised and lowered? The canal has a water lock system that acts like a massive elevator. When ships enter the locks, they're raised by water from the lake. Each lock raises the ships until they're 85 feet above sea level. They then travel across Gatun Lake. The ship is then lowered by the locks to sea level. On average, it takes 8 hours for ships to cross the canal. WOW! Our one-way cruise from Tampa to Long Beach, cruising through all of the canal's impressive locks will allow us to witness - first hand this marvel of modern engineering. The complete journey takes about 8-10 hours in each direction. What a wonderful sight to see!!
