That's my new slogan for the new 2020 Mid-Engine Corvette. It means the 0-60 times are 2.8 seconds and the price is less than \$60,000 dollars.

The July 18th reveal of the new C-8 was all GM said it would be. 1,500 people, from the press and Special Persons, were invited to Tustin, California to witness the unveiling of the new car. On July 19th, another group also went to the massive concrete hangers to greet the new Corvette. This group of people was the most important group to see the new Corvette. They were the ones who are purchasing the new car!

Corvette owners were invited to come, and they came by the hundreds. Corvettes, old and new, parked around Hanger #2.

The presentation gave the highlights of the 8th Generation of the Corvette. An all new passenger compartment has moved forward 16.5 inches making entry very easy. The engine is a carryover from the C-7. A 6.2 liter, push rod V-8, is very similar to the original V-8 from 1955. The LT2 has a dry-sump lubrication system with output at 495 HP. Other engines will be added with new models in the future.

ALL AMERICAN ORIGINALS CAR SHOW

ENDERLE CENTER, TUSTIN, CA

July 14, 2019

Today I attended the All American Originals Car Show (AAOCS) in Tustin, California. The event was held at the Enderle Center, where Crab Cooker, 17th street grill and ZOV's are tenants. I figure this description will connect with all you foodies! Anyway, having recently acquired a 1965 Corvette coupe, I figured why not join fellow CSS members and multi-award winning car show champions, Richard and Sarah Cheek. This is my story.....

Well let's go back a few weeks to give you all some perspective and this way you will be able to share in the joy, pain, euphoria, sadness, heartbreak, elation, pride and fun I have experienced being a new owner of a 50 plus year old car. Not just any car - a Corvette!

The story really begins months ago when during one of our many alcohol fueled discussions with fellow CSS members, Brad and Ann Lee. "Wouldn't it be cool to have an old car?" "We could go to car shows where they don't let us bring the C6 and C7". "Yeah! We should get one" Well you can imagine the conversation - right?! So...what does Mr. Lee go and do???? He gets himself a really nice 1969 C3- blue (don't ask which blue), 350, Coupe with T-tops and removable back window, rally wheels, and on and on. Man what a nice car! Chrome bumpers on both ends, side pipe, and best of all...that old car smell! Its hard to describe unless you're a car nut, but it's an unburned gas, un-filtered exhaust, a bit of GM vinyl glue, and aging carpet. You gotta love it! That's how a car is supposed to smell.

We get our first glimpse of this bad-ass machine at Ruby's Cruise night in Whittier. The car fit right in with all the other pre-75 classics. Some hot rods, some muscle cars, some restomods, and some plain survivors. Nonetheless a cool place to hang out and show off the car. Great job Brad and Ann!

Well, I don't know if it was the alcohol kicking back in or what, but somehow that old car bug started getting me in the mood for a classic. So the search began.

Well like many of you, my first instinct is to ask the world wide web (www). That is the internet for you senior folks --- hahahahaha. I start googling, ebay-ing, amazon-ing, autotrader classic-ing, and so on. Before long I happen upon a car that is described as a clean, basic driver quality car. It's a C2, with a 327 motor and a powerglide trans. Well, from the pictures it looked clean and sounded pretty good. One Saturday, I go down and see it in person. In person it looks good. No big dings or scratches, the interior is in good shape with no cracks or rips, and has the right smell. Even better, it is the lowest price C2 I have come across so far. The following week, I make a deal and the car is mine!

The seller has had for the past 40 years (proof by showing me registrations back to 1978) and says EVERYTHING works and it needs NOTHING. I was fully prepared to put some work (money) into it, just tell me so I know...but he says, "nope - needs nothing but a driver". Cool...deal is done. Hand over the cash and drive away. JOY

Get the car home and wash it. Fill her up with gas and take the wife for a cruise. We go on a little drive and she says the floor feels "squishy". Yeah, the carpet on the passenger side is old and coming apart, so maybe it just needs fixing. Get back from the cruise and notice the floor looks wet. FEAR

I remove the floor mat and sure enough it's wet to the touch! It feels slightly greasy, but not thick grease. It does not smell like oil and it's not dark like oil???? It's anti freeze. The heater core is leaking into the car. MILD PANIC. No big deal. Disconnect the heater hoses, plumb it so it recirculates before entering the car and plan to fix it. Get some towels, soak up the wetness and refill the radiator with new Prestone and we're back in business. HAPPY

Well, of course, we gotta drive it to the next Club Meeting! As some of you saw, we sprung a huge leak. The lower radiator hose blew off and leaked out all of the coolant. Well, ya gotta stay calm in front of your Corvette peers - right? So, I shove the hose back on, fill the expansion tank back up with cool water (while the car is running) and start praying that we can get 10 miles and back in the garage before anything happens. ANXIETY





Well as luck would have it, we start to overheat in the first 2 miles. I call for my pit crew (Evan) and he brings a screw driver (not the drink-although that may have helped) and I proceed to re-install the lower heater hose. Not a big deal, hose is back on, all tight and we're back on the road. As I start driving, it's not leaking, but the temperature gauge is maxing out. We pull over and buy 3 gallons of water at a liquor store. Fill up the radiator again and the temp drops to normal range. RELIEF

Well, you get the idea. Since then, it's been a vacuum hose disconnected causing the car to run really rough, a trans needing $\frac{3}{4}$ pint of fluid to stop the banging into gear, and a good scrubbing. It's driving good. Let's go to a show..... CONFIDENT

The car is all cleaned up and ready to present – as a driver. I know it's no winner, but at least it's clean and has some character. I drive to the show, no issues, and get checked in. The show people direct me to my designated parking spot. There are 3 cars in my group - a 63 SWC fuelie, dark blue with red interior, and a 65 red, 396 convertible with white interior, and yours truly. I get parked and get to cleaning...windows, wheels, chrome, body, etc...yea man, detail spray was everywhere! Well, you know, it's looking pretty good. HAPPY

Parked next to me is the Godfather, the ultimate champ, the car show guy we all wanna be...Mr. Richard Cheek! Of course his car could win Best of Show after driving thru a mud pit...it's perfect. He's shining his baby up and getting a lot of attention. He had his former fan club stop by and ask him about the car, and even made some new fans. The new fans were even offering to buy it! It was great. Richard was very humble and spoke to everyone like a Rockstar to his groupies. Well a few hours into the show, we get visitors. Sarah Cheek, Bill and Pam DeForest, and Monica all show up and join the festivities. We talked about cars and CSS' party and had a general great time. The car show comradery is so great when shared with fellow CSS members. HUNGRY

Time to eat, so we go grab a bite at 17th Street Grille. Pretty basic - I can't even make up a story about lunch to make it sound interesting.... Other than good company of friends and car peeps. It's almost trophy time so let's get back to the cars! ANTICIPATION

This show was about original cars. Restored to original or original - no modifications of any kind. There were about a 110 cars in various classes A thru Z. If you walked the field, you saw stock, factory original cars from all American makes and time periods. Group L is where 63-72 Corvettes were placed. Group K was for C1s. They started the awards at category A and went on down the list. When they got to Group L, the excitement was building. Not for me, I knew my car was just a driver. But, as they call the winner and best of class for Group L....

YES!!! It's Richard CREEK. What?!?! The announcer changes his mind and calls out "1965 Red Corvette convertible - Richard Cheek!" YEAH! Winner winner....another trophy. Congrats Richard - well deserved. Richard's car - as you know is pure beauty. The way GM intended. Just sexy, racy, head turning, automotive art. Just to have a car in a show like this is awesome. It creates such a great feeling of pride and joy, making all the repairs and breakdowns worth it. Maybe someday we can follow Richard's footsteps and win something for the car. Where You Can Find Corvette Parts and Merchandise

For those of you who have been into Corvettes for awhile most – or all – of the following will not be news to you, but for you relative newcomers to the love of Vettes this offering is being made to help you find the parts you may need for your classic or the trim add-ons you might want to buy to personalize your Vette or the clothing, gear, etc. you might like to own to show others of your interest in the sport.

It's amazing just how many publications are out there that are dedicated to Corvettes and how helpful many of them can be. Following is a list and quick summary of the more popular catalogs that you might want to look into. Most of them are available for routine periodic mailing if you request it, and most of them have a web site from which you can peruse their offerings. Me, I prefer to receive the catalogs so that I can better see just what's out there I might not have not seen before.

The three largest, most popular catalogs with the most items that are non-"parts" are:

- a. Mid America Motorworks, www.mamotorworks.com, (800) 500-1500;
- b. Eckler's Corvette, www.ecklersCorvette.com, (800) 327-4868;
- c. Corvette America, www.CorvetteAmerica.com, (800) 458-3475.

Those publications periodically also publish catalogs geared specifically for a single generation of Corvettes so when they ask you for the year and model you drive don't be afraid to tell them.

Then there are catalogs that are almost exclusively for parts, especially of older model Corvettes:

- a. Volunteer Vette Products, www.volvette.com, (865) 521-9100;
- b. J & D Corvette, www.jdcorvette.com, (800) 838-8353 (located locally in Bellflower, CA).

For trim and accessory items as well as clothes, furniture and the like, you should look at:

- a. Corvette Central, www.CorvetteCentral.com, (800) 345-4122. They have an accessories catalog and a separate catalog of parts, etc., for each generation of Corvettes.
- b. Burston Marketing's Corvette Collection, www.CorvetteCollection.com, (800) 653-1375.
- c. And finally, the catalog from the retail store at the National Corvette Museum, www.CorvetteMuseum.org, (800) 538-3883.

In addition to the above, you might also consider visiting the show rooms of Corvette Mike's at 1133 North Tustin Avenue and West Coast Corvettes, 1210 N. Kraemer Blvd., both are located near each other in Anaheim just off the 91 freeway in Anaheim. They have a selection of GM authorized accessories and clothes for sale, as well as an indoor Corvette sales room with used road gems. Both also maintain service departments for installing accessories and the like and for general maintenance of Corvettes. West Coast Corvettes has a new catalog that was just released and is available for pick-up at the store. (Price is pre-printed on each catalog as \$12.95, but don't be fooled, they're free - just ask for one.)

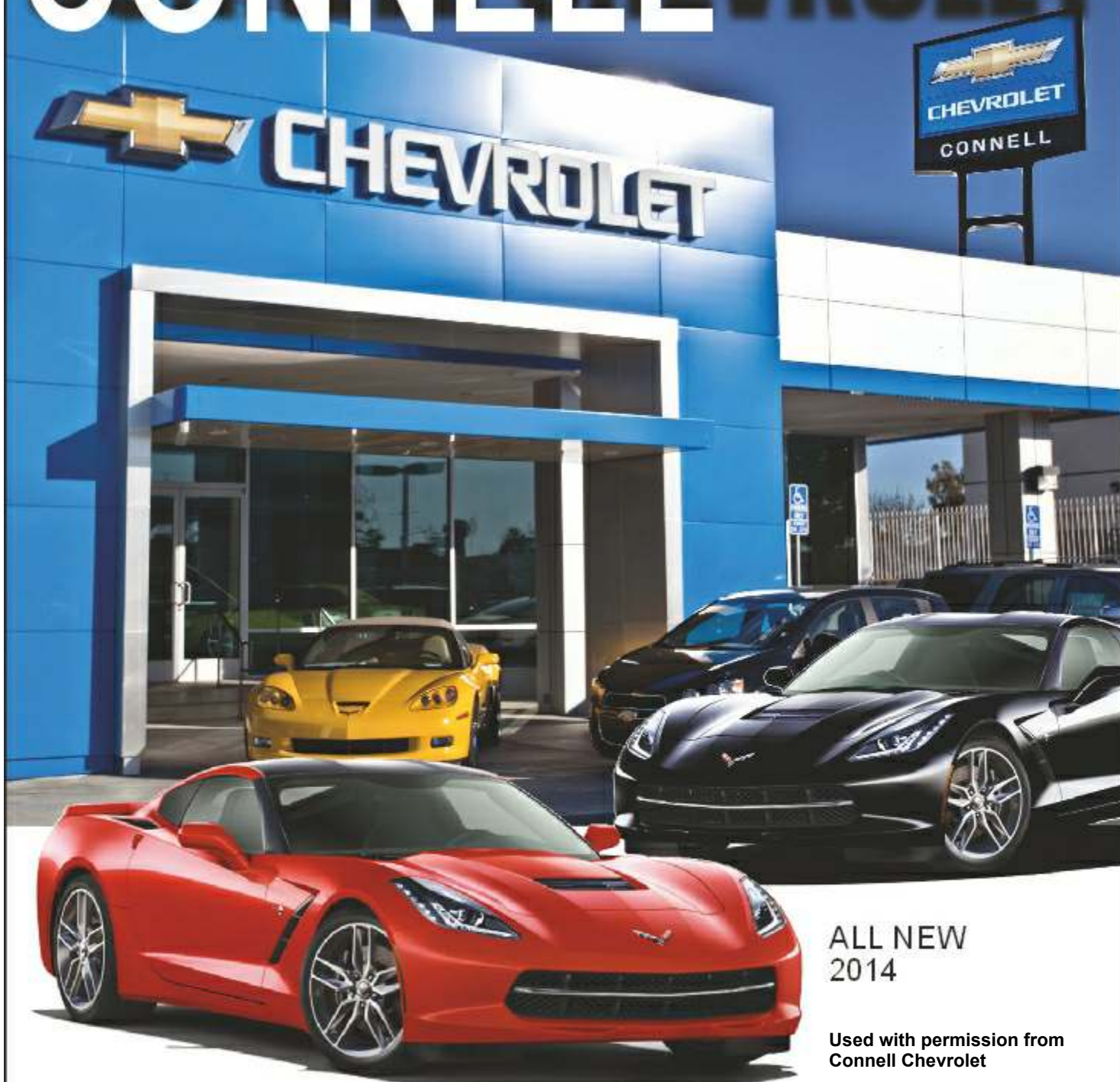

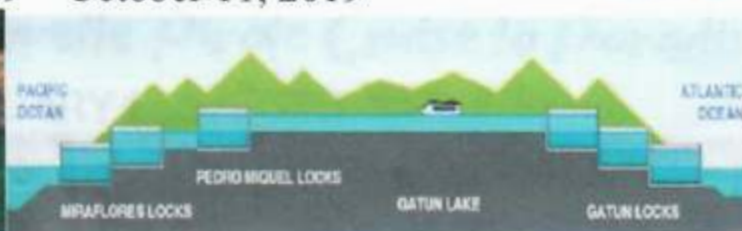

About 14,000 ships use it every year. The canal is about 48 miles long. It functions as a waterway between North and South America. The canal connects the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. Before the canal was built, ships had to sail 13,000 miles around the tip of South America and Cape Horn. How do the ships get raised and lowered? The canal has a water lock system that acts like a massive elevator. When ships enter the locks, they're raised by water from the lake. Each lock raises the ships until they're 85 feet above sea level. They then travel across Gatun Lake. The ship is then lowered by the locks to sea level. On average, it takes 8 hours for ships to cross the canal. WOW! Our one-way cruise from Tampa to Long Beach, cruising through all of the canal's impressive locks will allow us to witness - first hand this marvel of modern engineering. The complete journey takes about 8-10 hours in each direction. What a wonderful sight to see!!
