

With the July 18th unveiling of the mid-engine C-8 Corvette, the last C-7 will be sold at the Barrett-Jackson Auction in June. For the first time in 66 years, there will not be a front engine Corvette. The C-8 represents a new era of the Corvette evolution.

There is currently a large inventory of unsold C-7's in America. Buyers are waiting for the new models. So, the last C-7 will certainly not have any trouble selling!!

What does the last C-7 have to offer? It will be a Black Z06, which means it will be supercharged 6.2-liter LT4 V8 under the hood. It will have 650 HP and a 7-speed manual transmission. The car will also have the 3LZ trim package that includes a lot of leather, a Performance Data Recorder, Navigation, Android Auto and Apple Car Play.

As with many Barrett-Jackson Auctions, all proceeds from the sale of this Corvette will go to charity.





RMD's Message May 6, 2019

Hi Governors,

Your regional officers attended the national meetings in St. Louis this past weekend. I'm reporting on the Membership Committee meeting and the National Governors meeting.

Friday, May 3. Membership Committee meeting.

We currently have 17.857 members, which is down slightly from this time last year.

Soft copies of Blue Bars can be set up by checking the "Blue Bars Soft Copy" box for each member. That means that the member is expected to log in to the national NCCC web site and read Blue Bars there. The file is too large to append to an email, so it must be done this way.

The whole meeting was basically taken up by discussing ways to recruit new members. The problem is that NCCC is basically invisible to the average Corvette owner. The clubs may or may not be NCCC clubs. This is usually determined by one person with enough leadership charisma to run the club as he/she sees fit. The free memberships given to NCM delivery people have resulted in no renewals, so that doesn't seem to be worth the effort and cost.

Saturday, May 4. National Governors meeting.

The 2020 Convention will be in Indianapolis.

The 2021 Convention is in limbo because nobody has put in a bid yet (the bids are supposed to be submitted in February). They're flexible on this and in the past have accepted bids later in the year.

Blue Bars editor Elaine Heretta said that she needs articles for the summer issue. The articles are due by May 31.

Note that there is now a large blue button on the main NCCC web page that will take you to the NCCC group on Facebook.

There have been 9000 registrations for the caravan to the National Corvette Museum. That's the best reason I can think of for NOT being in Bowling Green during that week.

A new NCM director has been chosen to replace Wendell Strode, who is retiring. The name is a secret at this time

The 2019 Convention in Denver, CO was discussed and registration is still open. There have been 414 registrations so far and there are still some rooms left.

Where You Can Find Corvette Parts and Merchandise

For those of you who have been into Corvettes for awhile most – or all – of the following will not be news to you, but for you relative newcomers to the love of Vettes this offering is being made to help you find the parts you may need for your classic or the trim add-ons you might want to buy to personalize your Vette or the clothing, gear, etc. you might like to own to show others of your interest in the sport.

It's amazing just how many publications are out there that are dedicated to Corvettes and how helpful many of them can be. Following is a list and quick summary of the more popular catalogs that you might want to look into. Most of them are available for routine periodic mailing if you request it, and most of them have a web site from which you can peruse their offerings. Me, I prefer to receive the catalogs so that I can better see just what's out there I might not have not seen before.

The three largest, most popular catalogs with the most items that are non-"parts" are:

- a. Mid America Motorworks, <u>www.mamotorworkscom</u>, (800) 500-1500;
- b. Eckler's Corvette, www.ecklersCorvette.com, (800) 327-4868;
- c. Corvette America, <u>www.CorvetteAmerica.com</u>, (800) 458-3475.

Those publications periodically also publish catalogs geared specifically for a single generation of Corvettes so when they ask you for the year and model you drive don't be afraid to tell them.

Then there are catalogs that are almost exclusively for parts, especially of older model Corvettes:

- a. Volunteer Vette Products, www.volvette.com, (865) 521-9100;
- b. J & D Corvette, www.jdcorvette.com, (800) 838-8353 (located locally in Bellflower, CA).

For trim and accessory items as well as clothes, furniture and the like, you should look at:

- a. Corvette Central, www.CorvetteCentral.com, (800) 345-4122. They have an accessories catalog and a separate catalog of parts, etc., for each generation of Corvettes.
- b. Burston Marketing's Corvette Collection, www.CorvetteCollection.com, (800) 653-1375.
- c. And finally, the catalog from the retail store at the National Corvette Museum, www.CorvetteMuseum.org, (800) 538-3883.

In addition to the above, you might also consider visiting the show rooms of Corvette Mike's at 1133 North Tustin Avenue and West Coast Corvettes, 1210 N. Kraemer Blvd., both are located near each other in Anaheim just off the 91 freeway in Anaheim. They have a selection of GM authorized accessories and clothes for sale, as well as an indoor Corvette sales room with used road gems. Both also maintain service departments for installing accessories and the like and for general maintenance of Corvettes. West Coast Corvettes has a new catalog that was just released and is available for pick-up at the store. (Price is pre-printed on each catalog as \$12.95, but don't be fooled, they're free - just ask for one.)






















CORVETTE PIRATES PANAMA CANAL TRANSIT – TAMPA TO LONG BEACH

Weather - Come to Panama in February, March, September and October for the least chance of rain, although any month from mid-December to the beginning of May is fairly dry. The Panama Canal Zone has a tropical climate ranging from 75 to 85 degrees Fahrenheit, with high humidity year-round. The Caribbean side of the canal receives twice the amount of rain as Panama City and is infamous for having short, sudden afternoon thunderstorms from April through July.

Our Panama Canal Cruise on the Carnival Miracle will surely be a truly amazing experience that should not be missed. The Panama Canal is an engineering marvel built from 1903-1914. About 14,000 ships use it every year. The canal is about 48 miles long. It functions as a waterway between North and South America. The canal connects the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. Before the canal was built, ships had to sail 13,000 miles around the tip of South America and Cape Horn. How do the ships get raised and lowered? The canal has a water lock system that acts like a massive elevator. When ships enter the locks, they're raised by water from the lake. Each lock raises the ships until they're 85 feet above sea level. They then travel across Gatun Lake. The ship is then lowered by the locks to sea level. On average, it takes 8 hours for ships to cross the canal. WOW! Our one-way cruise from Tampa to Long Beach, cruising through all of the canal's impressive locks will allow us to witness - first hand this marvel of modern engineering. The complete journey takes about 8-10 hours in each direction. What a wonderful sight to see!!
