## President's Column September 2019

## "Pilgrimage to the Corvette Holy Land (Trip #4)

Pilgrimage: A journey to a place well known or respected. Holy Land: The place where the only sportscar in America is built.

The 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Corvette Museum took place in August and 4 of our members made the trek to Bowling Green, Kentucky. Phil and Sherry Anderson and Laura and I represented the Club. Phil and Sherry went with the Caravan out of Los Angeles with 225 of their "closest Corvette friends". Laura and I went with a smaller caravan of 5 cars from Corvettes of So. Cal.

It is 2066 miles to Bowling Green from Orange County and we made it in 5 days by averaging about 350 miles per day. We stopped at places like:

- (1) the only covered Bridge in Arizona,
- (2) Pie-O-Neer Café (Yummy) in Pietown, New Mexico,
- (3) the UFO Museum in Roswell, New Mexico,
- (4) an old restored 1950's Sinclair Gas Station
- (5) In Hope, Arkansas, we had lunch at Tailgaters Burgers (voted #1Cheeseburger in Arkansas)
- (6) Memphis, Tennessee was great! We saw the Hotel where Martin Luther King died, the Blues Museum and ate at the Central BBQ for real Memphis BBQ.

Finally, we made it to Bowling Green along with 5000 other Corvette enthusiasts! The excitement level was very high and the "wave" arm got very tired! LOL.

The picture of Laura & I in front of the Museum was taken by Kai Spande, Plant Director of the Assembly Plant and his Rapid Blue 2020 Corvette was in the parking lot. There were lots of events available to the attendees like driving the motor sports track, tours of Caverns, dinner at Shaker Village, and tours at Maker's Mark Distillery just to name a few.

After leaving Bowling Green, we went and visited family in Illinois, friends in Indiana, and then traveled to my hometown of Ipava, Illinois (Pop. 400). We checked our farm out (crops are doing well), went to our farmer's daughter's wedding (held in the barn with reception at a winery) and much more. But the highlight of visiting Ipava was the annual "Camp Ellis Days" (a training & WWII Prisoner of War Army Camp in the middle of Illinois - interesting story to look up). The event features a Parade of local kids on floats, town dignitaries riding in cars, about 30 restored farm tractors and one Red Corvette. Yes, we were put in the parade! Red Corvettes are not too common in rural farming towns. After the parade, we had lunch where I ran into some High School classmates and reminisced . . . Super Fun!

5,531 miles later. We were HOME. It was a wonderful trip, and a big check off the bucket list. We made new friends and were able to drive across country in a very comfortable, gas efficient Corvette.

The trip to Bowling Green in your Corvette should be on your 'Bucket List". It was a ride of a lifetime.






Ron De Bartolomeis led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

A quorum was declared to be present by Acting Secretary Sue Rosen.

Vice-President Wayne Heard called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Donna Stewart introduced our guest: Robert Payonon. He has a green Corvette, his first. He lives in Whittier.

It was moved, seconded, and passed to waive the reading of last month's minutes.

Treasurer Monica Valparaiso gave the report on the current cash balance. The storage unit was renewed for fourteen months, a deposit was put down for the January 11 banquet, and money is there for the car show. Monica told everyone not to forget to register for the car show if you're planning on going. The car show is in October, membership dues are due in November, and the banquet money is due in December. Monica gave us more information on the banquet: It is January 11 at the Phoenix Club. The contract has been signed, and the committee will pick the menu and decide on centerpieces. Monica then shared information on club-wear: Glenda has some T-shirts and polos. If we want to go to Glenda's, the earliest she is available is October 13. ## RMD's Message - September 9, 2019

## Friday, September 6 — Membership Meeting

The important renewal dates are: the database will close on approximately 10-15-19. This is to switch over to renewal mode. At that time the members added after 9-1-19 will change status to AutoRenewPrimary/Spouse at no charge. Regular Primary members will change to \$25 and Spouses will remain at \$10, as always. The database will reopen for renewals on approximately 10-17-19.

Now that Shannon Davis has taken over the FCOA position, the FCOA membership database has been incorporated in the regular membership database. The FCOA information is private and is not accessible.

Andy Alleshouse gave a presentation on product life cycles, which applies to NCCC clubs. Generally, membership rises quickly right after a club is formed. Then the rate of growth tapers off and eventually reaches a peak. After that membership drops until the club disbands. The drop off doesn't have to happen and the club can grow if the club leadership can generate a growth in membership.

Generally, the number of clubs has decreased in recent years. The overall number of NCCC members has increased. This means that existing clubs are growing in membership numbers.

Ways to recruit new members was discussed. It was noted that NCCC had a presence at all recent big Corvette events, like Carlisle and FunFest. NCCC had a booth at those events and many people who visited the NCCC booth were not aware that NCCC existed, so we are not advertising NCCC effectively.

### Saturday, September 7 — National Governors Meeting

VP of Membership Amelia Workman said we currently have 18408 members. That number will drop at renewal time. Approximately 20% will not renew and about 10% will renew late.

Business Manager Jim Walton said the 2021 Convention will be hosted by East Ohio in Cleveland.

The Denver Convention had a profit of \$21,600+. That will be split between the hosting clubs and NCCC.

The 2020 Convention will be in Indianapolis on July 5 through 10.

The 2019 voting will take place during the month of October. The only contested office is for VP of Competition. The candidates are Joe Eller and Bill Docherty. The By-Law changes are available on the NCCC web site.

## Where You Can Find Corvette Parts and Merchandise

For those of you who have been into Corvettes for awhile most – or all – of the following will not be news to you, but for you relative newcomers to the love of Vettes this offering is being made to help you find the parts you may need for your classic or the trim add-ons you might want to buy to personalize your Vette or the clothing, gear, etc. you might like to own to show others of your interest in the sport.

It's amazing just how many publications are out there that are dedicated to Corvettes and how helpful many of them can be. Following is a list and quick summary of the more popular catalogs that you might want to look into. Most of them are available for routine periodic mailing if you request it, and most of them have a web site from which you can peruse their offerings. Me, I prefer to receive the catalogs so that I can better see just what's out there I might not have not seen before.

The three largest, most popular catalogs with the most items that are non-"parts" are:

- a. Mid America Motorworks, <u>www.mamotorworkscom</u>, (800) 500-1500;
- b. Eckler's Corvette, www.ecklersCorvette.com, (800) 327-4868;
- c. Corvette America, www.CorvetteAmerica.com, (800) 458-3475.

Those publications periodically also publish catalogs geared specifically for a single generation of Corvettes so when they ask you for the year and model you drive don't be afraid to tell them.

Then there are catalogs that are almost exclusively for parts, especially of older model Corvettes:

- a. Volunteer Vette Products, www.volvette.com, (865) 521-9100;
- b. J & D Corvette, www.jdcorvette.com, (800) 838-8353 (located locally in Bellflower, CA).

For trim and accessory items as well as clothes, furniture and the like, you should look at:

- a. Corvette Central, www.CorvetteCentral.com, (800) 345-4122. They have an accessories catalog and a separate catalog of parts, etc., for each generation of Corvettes.
- b. Burston Marketing's Corvette Collection, www.CorvetteCollection.com, (800) 653-1375.
- c. And finally, the catalog from the retail store at the National Corvette Museum, www.CorvetteMuseum.org, (800) 538-3883.

In addition to the above, you might also consider visiting the show rooms of Corvette Mike's at 1133 North Tustin Avenue and West Coast Corvettes, 1210 N. Kraemer Blvd., both are located near each other in Anaheim just off the 91 freeway in Anaheim. They have a selection of GM authorized accessories and clothes for sale, as well as an indoor Corvette sales room with used road gems. Both also maintain service departments for installing accessories and the like and for general maintenance of Corvettes. West Coast Corvettes has a new catalog that was just released and is available for pick-up at the store. (Price is pre-printed on each catalog as \$12.95, but don't be fooled, they're free - just ask for one.)


















