1956 Corvette Pedal Car

Donated by Joseph and Debra Keener of Fair Oaks Ranch, Texas.

Joseph Keener's grandfather, Dr. E.A. Trinkle, was a doctor in Weston, West Virginia, for 46 years where the Feeney Chevrolet Dealership was located. In 1956, the Corvette pedal car was being displayed in the Feeney one-car showroom where Dr. Trinkle noticed this great toy. He wanted this car for his only grandchild, Joseph, and asked to purchase the Corvette pedal car. The owner, Tom Feeney, told Dr. Trinkle that the pedal car was not for sale.

Since Dr. Trinkle was the only doctor in town and he was the Feeney's family doctor, he jokingly said, "Don't call me in the middle of the night when you get sick!" A short time later, when the car was no longer being used as a promotion, Mr. Feeney brought the car to Dr. Trinkle as a gift and Dr. Trinkle immediately gave the 1956 Corvette pedal car to his grandchild, Joseph. Joseph is quite sure this gift started what became a lifelong obsession, as he has owned and driven Corvettes all of his life.

The Corvette pedal car has been in Joseph's family since 1956. Joseph said, "My grandfather would be pleased that I have kept the pedal car all of these years and he would be very proud that I donated this pedal car to the National Automobile Museum where it is displayed by the National Automobile Museum. There are only 20 of these promotional Corvette items. This is one of the rarest of Corvette collectible items."

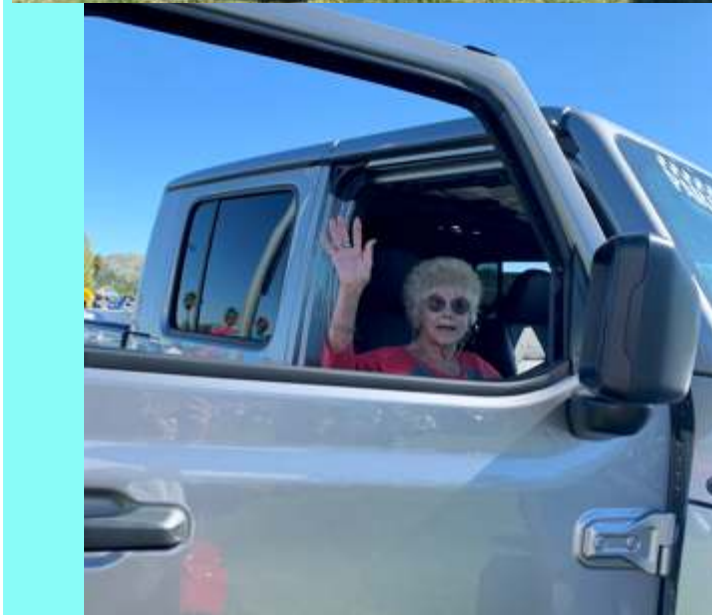

It's amazing just how many publications are out there that are dedicated to Corvettes and how helpful many of them can be. Those publications periodically also publish catalogs geared specifically for a single generation of Corvettes so when they ask you for the year and model you drive don't be afraid to tell them.

Then there are catalogs that are almost exclusively for parts, especially of older model Corvettes:

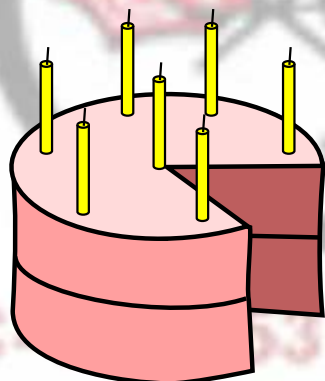

- c. And finally, the catalog from the retail store at the National Corvette Museum, www.CorvetteMuseum.org, (800) 538-3883.

In addition to the above, you might also consider visiting the show rooms of Corvette Mike's at 1133 North Tustin Avenue and West Coast Corvettes, 1210 N. Kraemer Blvd., both are located near each other in Anaheim just off the 91 freeway in Anaheim. They have a selection of GM authorized accessories and clothes for sale, as well as an indoor Corvette sales room with used road gems. Both also maintain service departments for installing accessories and the like and for general maintenance of Corvettes. West Coast Corvettes has a new catalog that was just released and is available for pick-up at the store. (Price is pre-printed on each catalog as \$12.95, but don't be fooled, they're free - just ask for one.)

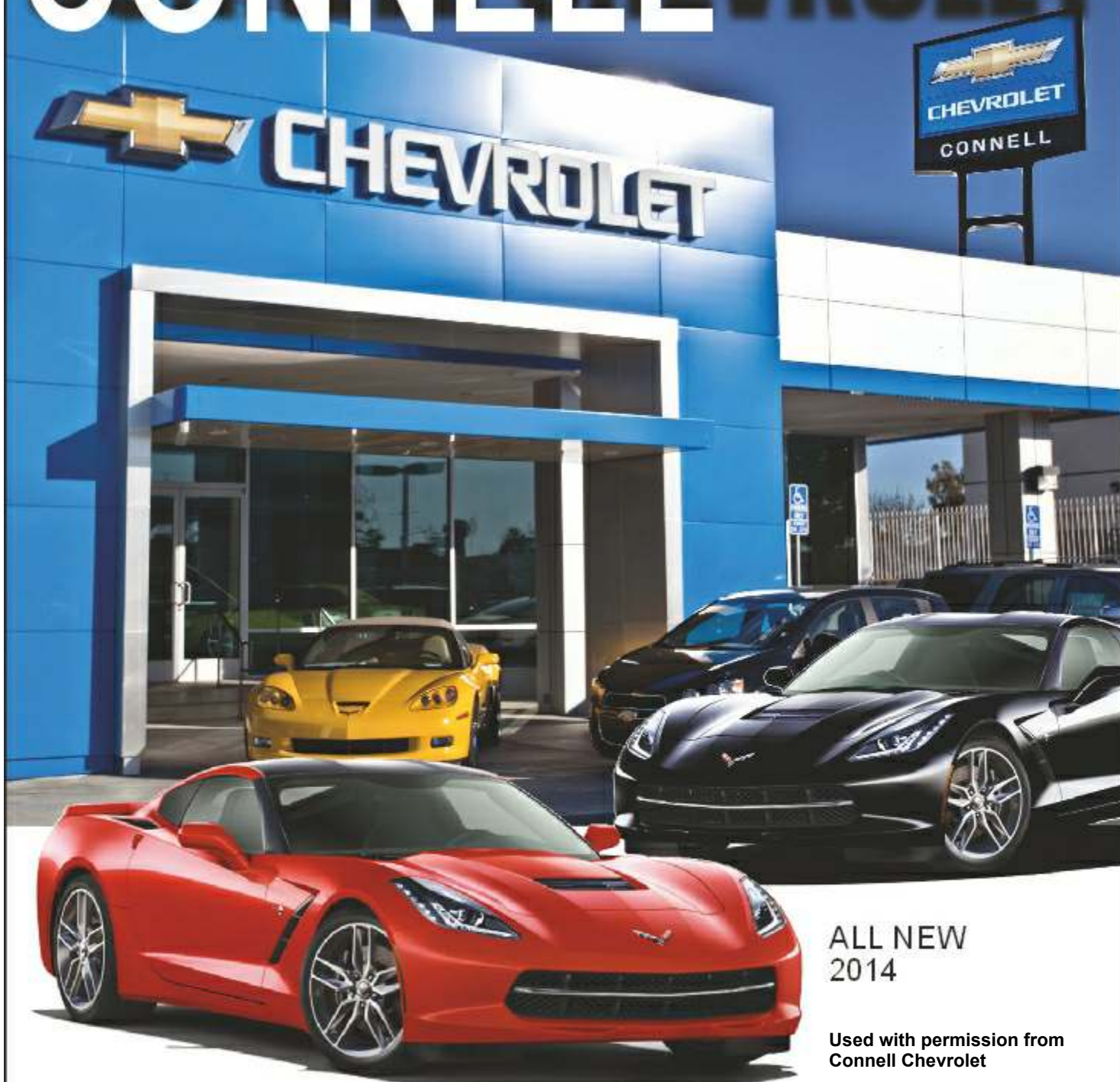
