The Mako Shark design was a product of Bill Mitchell and Designer Larry Schinoda. The car would show the design of the next generation of the Corvette – the C-2. The streamlining pointed snout and other detailing was partly inspired by the sleek, fast-moving shortfin Mako Shark.

The story goes that Bill Mitchell had an actual Mako Shark mounted on the wall of his office and ordered his team to paint the car to match the distinctive Blue-Gray upper blending into the white under side of the Fish.

After numerous attempts to match the Shark's color scheme failed, the team hit upon the idea of kidnapping the fish and painting it to match the car. Mitchell never realized the difference and ok'd the final paint scheme.

# Who is Bill Wisnowski? By, Arthur Huhta



### Ironman

There is a saying, "Swim 2.4 miles, Bike 112 miles, Run 26.2 miles and brag the rest of your Life". As a person in my late fifties, I decided to try and achieve this incredible goal. I had not been a high school athlete, nor a collegiate athlete. I did participate in sports activities throughout my life and had some moderate success later in my adult life playing golf and tennis. I discovered the gym and weightlifting during my 20's and continued to be a "gym person" in order to maintain somewhat healthy bodyweight. I even considered myself "fit" when my college Levi's fit me at age 42!!

Well, thinking you are fit, and being fit are vastly different. This reality hit me square in the face the first time I tried swimming. I went to the gym and jumped in the pool. At the time the water was a freezing 74 degrees! I overcame the cold and set out to swim 1000 yards. A typical gym pool is 25 yards long, so its forty (40) laps...ok cool should not be a problem. I could not even complete one (1) lap. I could not get from one end of the pool to the other.

Running faster involves moving your legs faster. In tennis, making the ball go back faster means hitting harder. In baseball, pitching a ball with greater speed means accelerating your arm (with some technique) faster. As you may or may not know, swimming is the opposite, you can't just do it "harder". You can't swim faster by applying more strength or spinning your arms faster or kicking faster. Swimming efficiently is a combination of reducing drag and increasing propulsion. (The car guys should understand that!) In order to improve as an "Adult Onset Swimmer", I have swum 251,562 yards or 142 miles in the past year.

The biking and running portions of the Ironman race are more familiar to me. I had ridden a bike as a child and needed to increase my endurance. Similarly, I am familiar with running and needed to build my endurance. Building the required stamina to bike for 112 miles and run 26.2 miles is a process. Biking or running everyday won't build the muscle and lung capacity needed. I can share that initially my longest bike ride was 20 miles and I thought I was a bad-ass. However, after that ride, I couldn't even walk. My legs were cramping in places I didn't even realize could have a cramp. Now what?

As for running, I had done the LA Marathon a long time ago...how long ago you ask? 28 years ago I completed the marathon in 6:09, or six hours and nine minutes. For perspective, that had been the longest I had ever run in my life. I had participated in and completed 3 half marathons (13.1 miles) since then and now. Like building biking endurance, I needed to build running endurance. In order to do so, I needed time. Building the stamina and endurance necessary to complete a 2.4-mile swim, 112-mile bike, and a 26.2-mile run, requires dedication to training. My strategy was to hire a coach who could help my endurance. The coach started my training by assigning daily, targeted workouts. In retrospect, in the past 365 days I have **biked 4,548** miles and **ran 911** miles.

Another interesting hurdle to overcome to become an Ironman is TIME. The race requires that racers complete the course in a fixed amount of time or be disqualified. For a 70.3 (half Ironman) one must complete the course in no more than 8 hours and 30 minutes total. However, a racer cannot take more than 1 hour and 10 minutes to complete the SWIM or be disqualified. If the racer successfully finishes the swim in time, they must complete the bike portion in less than 5 total hours, including the swim, or be disqualified. Ultimately, the racer must then run to complete the balance of the course in 8 hours 30 minutes total, including the swim and bike.

A full Ironman race covers 140.6 miles- 2.4-mile swim, 112-mile bike, 26.2-mile run. For this race, time is also a factor. Like the above description, the racer has 2 hours 20 minutes to complete the swim, a total of 10 hours to complete the swim and bike, and a total of 17 hours to finish the entire course. As above, missing the incremental times can get you disqualified.

Over the past year, I have improved my swim times, my biking speed, and my running speed. I am happy to share that I have completed Ironman 70.3 St. George, Ironman 70.3 Santa Cruz (2021 and 2022), Ironman 70.3 Indian Wells, Ironman 70.3 (Coeur d Alene), and the Ironman World Championships 140.6 St. George, as well as my second 140.6 Ironman in Sacramento, just last weekend. At age 57, there is no feeling that can describe crossing the finish line and hearing your name called followed by "You are an Ironman".

We're planning on a couple guest speakers, the usual assortment of competitive events, some fun tours and trips, and of course some parties. Friday night's party will include a 70th birthday party for the Corvette. You won't want to miss it.

I recently attended the 28th anniversary at the National Corvette Museum. In addition to board meetings, I attended a banquet and a special VIP viewing of the documentary "Boundless- Betty Skelton. Betty Skelton was known as the "First Lady of Firsts," and made a lasting impact, breaking gender barriers in Motorsports, aviation, astronautics, and even in the advertising business throughout the 1950's and 60's. Betty's list of record setting achievements are numerous and many are still unparalleled today". Betty Skelton was inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame in 2001. Very impressive! Friday night I attended the NCM Hall of Fame induction ceremony. The 2022 inductees were: Elfi Arkus-Duntov – the first lady of Corvette, Gary Pratt & Jim Miller – founders of Pratt & Miller Engineering, and Ed Welburn – Retired VP, GM Global Design. A very impressive evening and the entire 4 days in Bowling Green were fantastic. In addition to the above, you might also consider visiting the show rooms of Corvette Mike's at 1133 North Tustin Avenue and West Coast Corvettes, 1210 N. Kraemer Blvd., both are located near each other in Anaheim just off the 91 freeway in Anaheim. They have a selection of GM authorized accessories and clothes for sale, as well as an indoor Corvette sales room with used road gems. Both also maintain service departments for installing accessories and the like and for general maintenance of Corvettes. West Coast Corvettes has a new catalog that was just released and is available for pick-up at the store. (Price is pre-printed on each catalog as \$12.95, but don't be fooled, they're free - just ask for one.)


















